Competing for a \$4 million purse, 132 PGA TOUR professionals will tee off on the Seaside course at Sea Island Golf Club. After two rounds of play, the field will be cut to 70 players (+ties). Defending champion Heath Slocum, tournament host Davis Love III, 2011 Wells Fargo Champion Lucas Glover, six time PGA TOUR winner Stewart Cink, 2010's Tour Player of the Year Jim Furyk, other Golden Isles residents Zach Johnson, Matt Kuchar and Jonathan Byrd and many other top players have already committed to play.

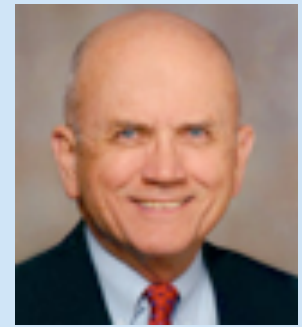

Triple Play Is Back

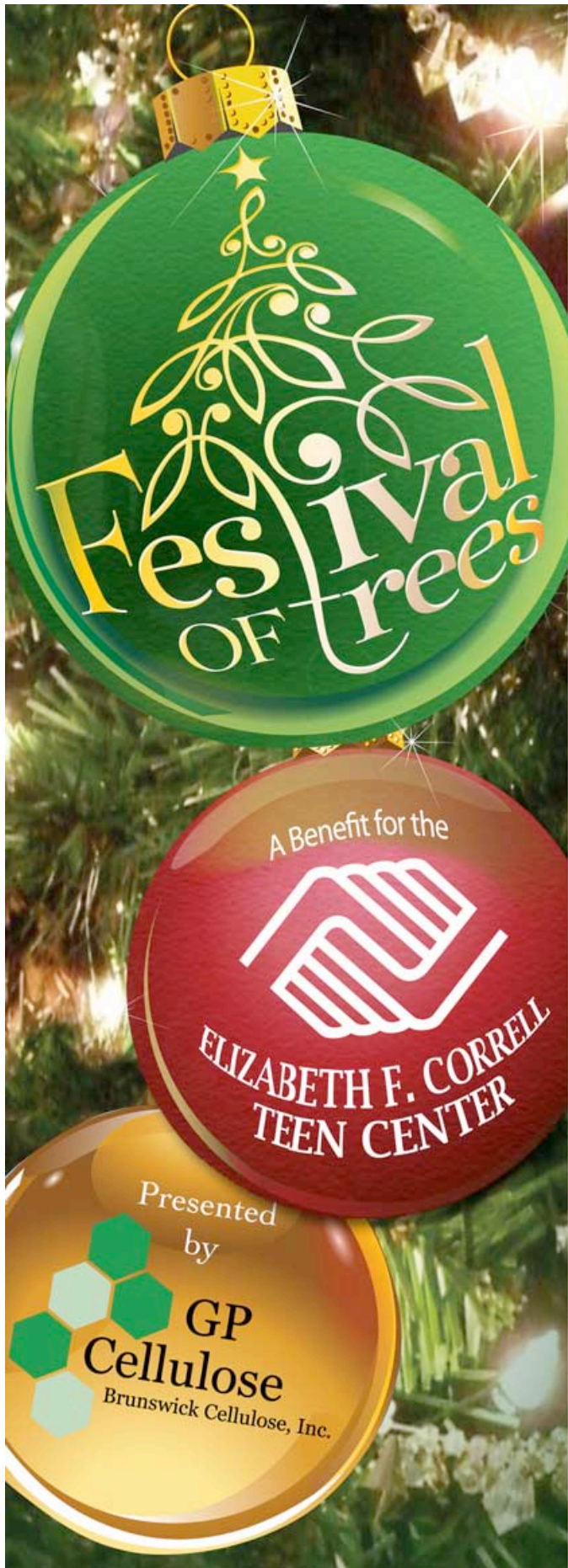
As childhood obesity rates continue to climb and America's health worsens, **Boys & Girls Clubs of Southeast Georgia** and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Georgia (BCBSGa) Foundation are fighting back. Today, the two organizations announced that **Boys & Girls Clubs of Southeast Georgia** will receive a grant to implement Triple Play programming.

Triple Play: A Game Plan for the Mind, Body and Soul, is Boys & Girls Clubs of America's proven health and wellness program. Supported by founding sponsor Coca-Cola and co-sponsor, the Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Georgia (BCBSGa) Foundation, the program encourages Club members to eat healthier (mind), become more physically active (body) and increase their ability to engage in healthy relationships (soul).

A recent study of more than 2,000 children ages 9-14 who attend Boys & Girls Clubs showed that Triple Play succeeded in getting them to exercise more, eat healthier foods and feel better about themselves. Triple Play kids increased to 90 percent of the federally recommended amount of daily exercise, which is 60 minutes a day for children, while their peers outside the program decreased to 78 percent.

We look forward to the continued success of the Triple Play program for our members at The Club.

Christmas Comes Early

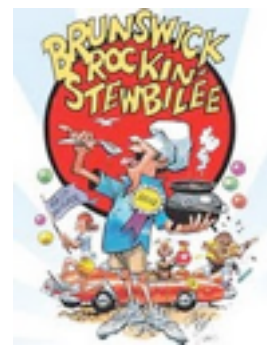

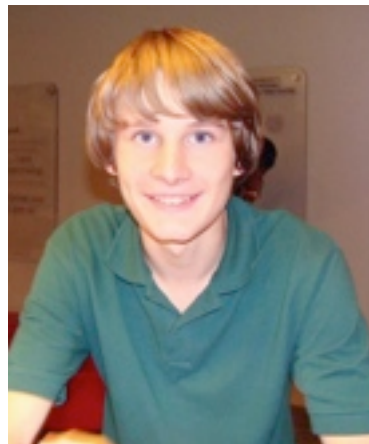
